Insights For Selling To Ben

👉 During A Call Or A Meeting

DO's

- Show them how they look good by making this decision
- If possible, involve their colleagues in the sales process
- Take time to make them feel comfortable before getting to the main pitch

DONT's

- Don't sound very transactional
- Don't ask too many questions that sound too dry and objective
- Avoid unnecessary confrontation if it arises incidentally

👉 When Cold Calling

Insights

Pattern Interrupt: Informal style, where you are talking in a friendly & casual manner, with a big smile on makes them want to speak to you.

Pace: Don't be too fast or too slow, stay in the middle. Sound like a 'brings happiness to others' person.

Tone: Speak with high energy and in a personal manner, as if you have met a friend suddenly after a long time.

Tactics To Win: Giving social proof, personal rapport, usage of superlatives, repeating their name.

Mistakes To Avoid: Information overload, use of negations

Making The Ask: Use positivity and/or humor to make the ask. It appeals to them, as if you are bringing a cheer to their day. (Avoid doing this with Dominant or Calculative types)

Subconscious Driver: They are driven by emotion more than any other type. Hence a proposition that excites them will immediately get their attention.

Script

Greeting: Hey Ben, [user_fname] here at [user_companynamewithfirsttwowords] calling you this morning/evening!

Opener: Now I know how much people love cold calls, so how about 30 seconds to tell you what I have for you?

Introduction: We have built an AI that predicts exactly what will build a solid relationship with each prospect before you even spend a minute with them.

Ask: Ben, leaders just like you at companies like [abc], [xyz] have been blown away with what they have seen, why don't we put 15 minutes on your calendar to show you if what I am saying is actually real, yeah?

Close: So morning at around [time] next [tuesday], shall we say? And is it [prospect_email]? Don't want to get that wrong you know!

👉 When Writing An Email

Subject: Personalized, clear

Example: John, let's close this tomorrow?', 'You will get this!' etc.

Salutation: Yes (Something formal)

Example: Use 'Hi', 'Hello' etc. (along with the first name)

Greeting: Yes (Say something usual)

Example: Say something usual and friendly, like 'It's a real pleasure'

Emojis/GIFs:

Bullet Points: Avoid

Closing Line: Close on a positive note

Example: Something like 'I am excited to discuss this tomorrow, does 11 am work well?'

Complimentary Close: Unique, pleasant

Example: Something like 'Looking forward!', 'To new beginnings!' etc.

Tone of Words: Friendly, exciting

Overall Messaging: Focused on social proof

Length of Mail: Medium

Example: Ideally upto 130-150 words

👉 While Negotiating & Closing

The secret to closing fast with Ben is

- *Relationships can play a major role, followed by low risk and strong market validation.*

Will you ever get a clear answer from Ben

- *They are not very direct, and unlikely to say no to your face.*

Can Ben Take Some Risk Or Not?

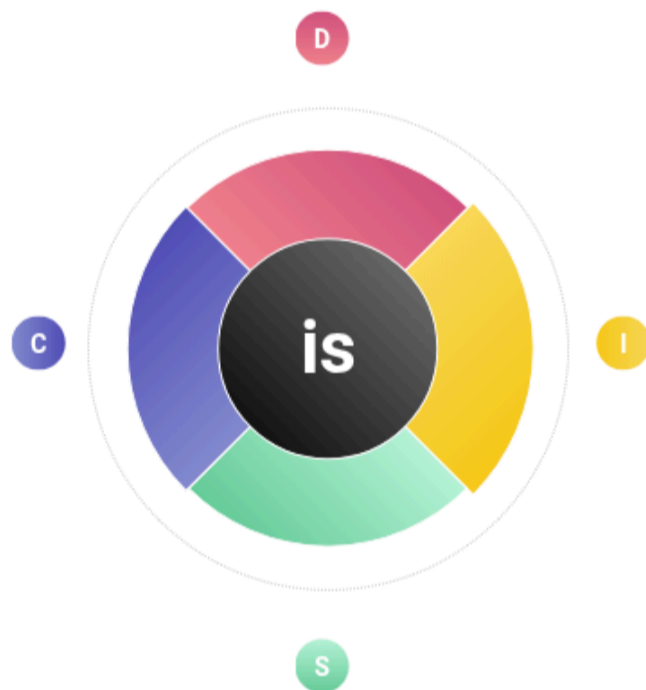
- *It is unlikely that they will take many risks.*

INFLUENCE
