Insights For Selling To Christopher

👉 During A Call Or A Meeting

DO's

- Talk about their team and how your product will help them do things better and easier
- Use adjectives like 'amazing', 'coolest', 'unbelievable' etc.
- Talk anecdotally about the customer experience that your product offers

DONT's

- Don't be too formal, focus on building comfort and trust
- Avoid cutting into their flow
- Avoid ifs and buts, don't talk too much about the risks etc.

👉 When Cold Calling

Insights

Pattern Interrupt: Informal style, where you are talking in a friendly & casual manner, with a big smile on makes them want to speak to you.

Pace: Don't be too fast or too slow, stay in the middle. Sound like a 'brings happiness to others' person.

Tone: Speak with high energy and in a personal manner, as if you have met a friend suddenly after a long time.

Tactics To Win: Giving social proof, personal rapport, usage of superlatives, repeating their name.

Mistakes To Avoid: Information overload, use of negations

Making The Ask: Use positivity and/or humor to make the ask. It appeals to them, as if you are bringing a cheer to their day. (Avoid doing this with Dominant or Calculative types)

Subconscious Driver: They are driven by emotion more than any other type. Hence a proposition that excites them will immediately get their attention.

Script

Greeting: Hey Christopher, [user_fname] here at [user_companynamewordstwowords] calling you this morning/evening!

Opener: Now I know how much people love cold calls, so how about 30 seconds to tell you what I have for you?

Introduction: We have built an AI that predicts exactly what will build a solid relationship with each prospect before you even spend a minute with them.

Ask: Christopher, leaders just like you at companies like [abc], [xyz] have been blown away with what they have seen, why don't we put 15 minutes on your calendar to show you if what I am saying is actually real, yeah?

Close: So morning at around [time] next [tuesday], shall we say? And is it [prospect_email]? Don't want to get that wrong you know!

👉 When Writing An Email

Subject: Personalized, catchy

Example: John, is this interesting?', 'Increasing sales conversion, together!' etc.

Salutation: Yes (Something casual)

Example: Use 'Hi', 'Hey' etc. (along with the first name)

Greeting: Yes (Say something interesting/unusual)

Example: Use unusual lines, like 'This has been quite a week', 'What a game yesterday' etc.

Emojis/GIFs:

Bullet Points: Avoid

Closing Line: Build excitement

Example: Something like 'So John, lets get the ball rolling?'

Complimentary Close: Unique, pleasant

Example: Something like 'Excited!', 'To a great partnership!' etc.

Tone of Words: Friendly, first-person

Overall Messaging: Focused on the person and relationship

Length of Mail: Long

Example: Maximum upto 150 words

👉 While Negotiating & Closing

The secret to closing fast with Christopher is

- *Relationship and trust can be vital with them, sometimes more than anything else.*

- *They are unlikely to say no directly, you have to make that decision yourself.*

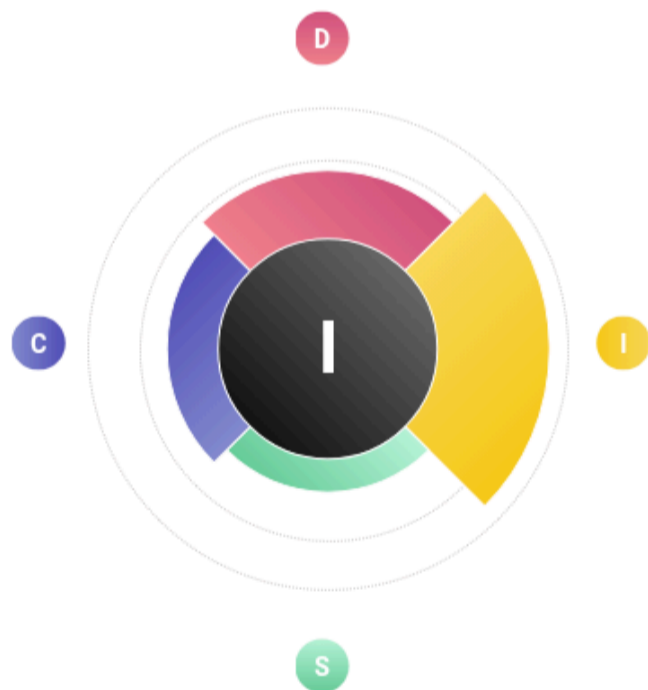

INFLUENCE
